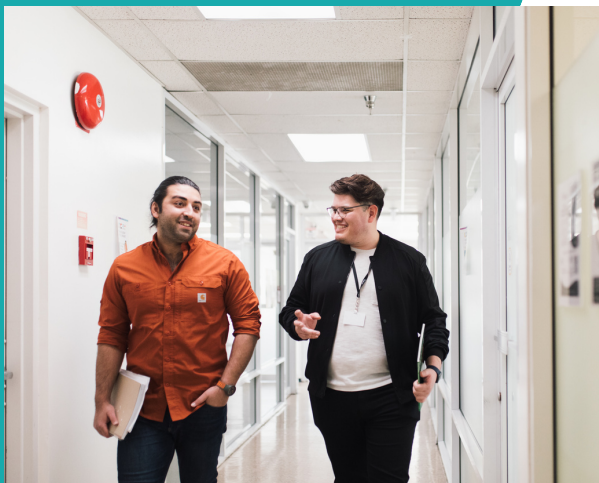

Vancouver is ranked as the fifth most livable city in the world on the Global Livability Index, according to the 2022 annual report published by The Economist Intelligence Unit. People in this Pacific Coast city enjoy access to downtown beaches, world-class restaurants, mountain trails, skiing and snowboarding as well as a vibrant urban culture set in the natural landscape.

- Vancouver has a mild climate, as it is protected by mountains and warmed by Pacific Ocean currents.

Part-Time English Programs

Intensive English

5 days/week, minimum 4 weeks.

This intense and fast-paced course is designed to challenge students to improve their English skills quickly. Bi-weekly quizzes, progress reports and in-class projects assist students to improve their language competencies.

General English

4 days/week, minimum 6 weeks.

This program is designed to improve the everyday English of ESL students. Students are placed in the appropriate level from Beginner (CLB 1) to Advanced (CLB 7).

Test preparation

4 days/week, minimum 5 or 6 weeks.

This course offers a comprehensive curriculum that covers test-taking strategies, listening comprehension, vocabulary development, reading skills, oral skills, essay and letter writing, and fundamental grammar skills. Students are exposed to university-level content including materials from **Academic English, IELTS, CELPIP, and TOEFL.**

Talk class

2 days/week, minimum 5 weeks.

This course is designed to help lower-intermediate level (CLB 3) ESL students improve their speaking and listening skills. Classes will teach practical language, vocabulary and idioms in fun ways such as debating, brainstorming and role playing.

FULL-TIME ENGLISH PROGRAMS

Combine General English, Intensive English and Test Preparation courses to create a full-time package that works for you.

Program details:

Improve your everyday English more quickly with a full-time program. Students are placed in courses according to their English level, and work their way to higher levels over time. Full-time programs cover all four essential skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing.

Length:

You can study English full-time for up to 72 weeks. If you register for more than 6 months (24 weeks) as a full-time student, the Canadian government allows you to apply for a study permit.

Price:

Full-time programs start from \$3,780 CAD for 28 weeks.

TESOL DIPLOMA

Overview

LCC's eight-week TESOL Diploma is offered online through daily video lessons and biweekly real-time online classes with a qualified TESOL Instructor. There are 128 hours of materials and activities in the five courses. Watch video lessons at your convenience, submit assignments daily and prepare a lesson plan and presentation for each course. Real-time online classes are Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:30 – 9:30 pm (attendance is mandatory).

BUSINESS DIPLOMA

Overview

This diploma program introduces students to fundamental skills of job search and business communication using the communicative approach. Areas of focus include exploration of a wide variety of business topics including finance, trade, marketing, customer service and office management skills. Students are required to do independent activities, graded assignments and/or exams for each course.

You will:

- Practice business vocabulary for a wide range of work-related topics
- Speak English professionally to find and keep work in Canada
- Write effective business letters, emails and other documents
- Handle challenging telephone conversations
- Understand basic accounting, banking and finance ideas
- Create Canadian-style resumes and cover letters for your job search

These diploma programs can be taken for 8 weeks for an overview of the subject matter, or for 24 weeks for a more in-depth program.

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STUDY AND WORK IN CANADA

How it works

Our Career Co-op Programs will get you working in Canada. Choose subjects related to your interests, and gain valuable skills that you can apply in your career. Our co-op programs are between 48 and 112 weeks long, including co-op work.

Study Term:

During your study term, you will complete the required diploma programs for your selected career co-op. In addition, you will take elective courses to improve your English communication skills and competencies.

Work Term:

During your work term, you will find work related to your Diploma program(s), with free job-finding assistance from LCC's Co-op Coordinator. You can work up to the same number of hours that you studied, but not more.

Post-Work Tutorial:

In the Post-Work Tutorial, you will review the strengths and weaknesses you noticed as an employee and formulate your future career plans.

CO-OP Entrance Requirements

Before registering for a co-op program, you need to show proof of English Proficiency. This can be done by providing a valid IELTS, TOEFL, CLBPT or CELPIP score, or by taking LCC's free online English assessment.

You need a Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) 5 or higher in at least two skills (no skill lower than 4), OR successful completion of the Business Diploma Program (BDP).

Students with higher CLB levels but no Canadian work experience or resume are also encouraged to take BDP, which will prepare them to work in Canada.

Before starting the co-op work term, all students are required to:

- Be at least 19 years old when the work term starts
- Successfully complete the co-op study term, and
- have a Canadian Social Insurance Number (SIN).

In addition, international students are required to

- have a Canadian Co-op Work Permit, and
- carry Canadian medical insurance for the duration of the program.



LEADERSHIP PREPARATION DIPLOMA WITH CO- OP

Overview

The Leadership Preparation Diploma (LPD) Program with Co-op is designed to introduce concepts and develop skills needed to be a future leader. LPD enables students to develop strong decision-making and organizational skills, to clarify goals and to lead a team. Students are required to do independent activities, graded assignments and/or exams for each course; each student will work on individual as well as group projects. Co-op students can find work in many different areas once their study term is complete.

Career Options

This program provides training for careers in many occupational areas, including the following National Occupational Classifications (NOCs):

- **0421** Administrators – post-secondary education & vocational training
- **6211** Retail sales supervisors
- **6314** Customer and information services supervisors
- **6316** Other service supervisors



PROFESSIONAL COMMUNICATION AND MARKETING DIPLOMA WITH CO-OP



Overview

The Professional Communication and Marketing (PCM) Diploma with Co-op introduces students to practical skills of workplace communication using the communicative approach. Areas of focus will include product and customer research, writing promotional materials, building relationships with customers, using social media at work, and managing relationships with bosses, coworkers and employees. Students are required to do independent activities, graded assignments and/or exams for each course; each student will work on individual as well as group projects. Co-op students find work in marketing and communications-related jobs once their study term is complete.

Career Options

This program provides training for careers in many occupational areas, including the following National Occupational Classifications (NOCs):

- **1123** Professional Occupations in Advertising, Marketing and Public Relations
- **4163** Business Development Officers and Marketing Researchers and Consultants
- **6411** Sales and Account Representatives – wholesale trade (non-technical)
- **6421** Retail Salespersons





GLOBAL TOURISM WITH CO-OP

Overview

The Global Tourism Diploma (GTD) program with Co-op introduces students to concepts needed of competent members of an international travel planning team. This program provides students with a background on tourism service suppliers and their social, cultural and political impact, as well as practical introductions to event planning, tour guiding, tourism promotion and customer service. Case studies and common travel problems will be examined. Co-op students work in the tourism sector once their study term is complete.

This program provides training for careers in many occupational areas, including the following National Occupational Classifications (NOCs):

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS MANAGEMENT SKILLS DIPLOMA WITH CO-OP



Overview

The International Business Management Skills (IBMS) Diploma program with Co-op is designed to introduce concepts and develop skills needed to manage a business in an international context. IBMS introduces students to practical skills of international workplace management using a communicative approach. Areas of focus include the cultural context of global management, creating global teams and networks, cross-cultural negotiation and decision-making, international management ethics, risk assessment and management, trade finance, payment methods, and formulating global strategies. Co-op students find work in a business related to their interests once their study term is complete.

This program provides training for careers in many occupational areas, including the following National Occupational Classifications (NOCs):

- **4163** Business Development Officers and Marketing Researchers and Consultants
- **1225** Purchasing agents and officers
- **1241** Administrative assistants
